International Photography Awards

(IPA) announced the finalists for the International Photographer of the Year, The Discovery of the Year and the Deeper Perspective Award for 2009 at the Lucie Awards on October 19, 2009 at the newly renovated Alice Tully Hall in Lincoln Center in New York City.



Neither water nor sanitary facilities are available in their living quarters."
