



Peace in Times of War


In Pursuit of Solitude



That moment in Vietnam has connected the lives of Kim and "Uncle Nick" to this day.








Zanzibaris (people from Zanzibar) normally don't show their affection in public. Ewa, Abdu and friend really seem to enjoy themselves.




One Love


Description: Nestled among the ferns in Titirangi is Vincent's art studio, where he takes a moment to pause in the morning light.



Description: Old fisherman at peace with nature in the waters of the Bay Of All Saints - Salvador - Bahia - Brazil.


